
A Moving Nation? For All Our Real Geographic Mobility, Lots of Americans Today Live in the City/Town Where They Lived at Age 16



Two-Thirds of Americans Say They Have Lived For At Least the Last Decade in Their Present City or Town


Question: How many years have you lived in... your own local community?






