Question: Do you think that people should stand when the Star Spangled Banner is played in public?



75% Star Spangled Banner





Question: Can someone be patriotic and still refuse to stand when the National Anthem is being played?










No Funny Money, Please





Question: The phrase "In God We Trust" has been printed on our currency since 1957. Do you think a different phrase or motto should be printed on our bills?


Question: Currently the federal government is considering getting rid of the one dollar bill and replacing it with a new one dollar coin. Would you favor or oppose that action?




