


Question: Would you describe the state of the nation's economy these days as excellent, good, not so good, or poor?




A Workers' Market

Question: How would you rate the availability of jobs in your community, as excellent, good, only fair, or poor?






Question: During the next twelve months, do you expect your income to go up more than prices go up, about the same, or less than prices go up?
