



## Of the People, By the People, For the People

Question: Do you think that the federal government usually acts in the best interests of people like yourself or does it usually act in the best interests of some other group of people?





Ouestion: When you read or hear about the laws or bills that government passes, do you usually feel that your own views on things are represented, or do you usually feel your own views are not represented?











**Question**: Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: it is the responsibility of the government to take care of people who can't take care of themselves?







**Question**: Which comes closer to your view: government should do more to promote traditional values; or government should not favor one set of values over another?





**Question**: If you had to choose, would you rather have a smaller government providing fewer services, or a bigger government providing more services?




