



"Do you approve or disapprove of this week's Supreme Court decision allowing states to pass laws that restrict abortion?



"Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the Supreme Court's (Webster) decision today (concerning abortion)?"













# ABORTION: A BALLOT ON STATE REGULATION

A number of different polling organizations have asked respondents their views on various proposed state regulations of abortion. In many cases, the responses to these regulation questions have been consistent from one survey organization to another, but in a few instances, they have not—where presumably, differences in question wording contributed to the varying results. Two such instances are shown in the boxes on pp. 28 and 29.

### Question text to all of the items shown on these two pages follow:

"Would you support or oppose the following restrictions on abortion that may come before state legislatures?...Women seeking abortions must be counseled on the dangers and on alternatives to abortion." (Gallup/Newsweek) "Which of these...would you favor in your state?...Requiring doctors to inform abortion patients about alternatives to having an abortion." (Time/Yankelovich Clancy Shulman).

"Would you favor or oppose requiring that at least one parent be told before a girl under 18 years of age could have an abortion?" (CBS News/New York Times) "Would you support or oppose a state law that would require that parents be notified before a female under 18 years of age can have an abortion? (Gordon Black/USA Today).

"Would you favor or oppose passing laws to make it difficult for private clinics to perform abortions, such as requiring them to have special equipment and staff like hospital operating rooms in order to be licensed?" (CBS News/New York Times, Sept. 1989). "Would you favor or oppose passing laws that would make it difficult for private clinics to perform abortions?" (CBS News/New York Times, July 1989).

"Would you favor or oppose requiring the consent of her parents before a girl under 18 years of age could have an abortion?" (CBS News/New York Times) "...favor or oppose such a restriction in your state...requiring that women under 18 years of age get parental consent before they are allowed to have an abortion?" (Gallup)

"Would you favor or oppose in a pregnancy of 20 weeks or more, requiring a test to make sure that the fetus is not developed enough to live outside the womb before a woman could have an abortion?" (CBS News/New York Times) "...favor or oppose such a restriction in your state...In cases where the mother is five months pregnant, requiring a test to see if the fetus might survive outside of the womb before allowing the abortion?" (Gallup)

"The Court...gave any state the right to prohibit public employees or public hospitals from performing abortions, except to save the mother's life (favor/oppose)?" (Los Angeles Times) "...favor or oppose such a restriction in your state...Not allowing abortions to be performed in public hospitals unless the abortion is required to save a woman's life?" (Gallup)

"Would you support or oppose the following restrictions on abortion that may come before state legislatures?...Public employees may not perform, assist in or advise abortion." (Gallup/Newsweek) "Which of these...would you favor in your state?...Prohibiting public employees from performing abortions." (Time/Yankelovich Clancy Shulman).
