



**Question:** How much attention would you say you are paying to the year 2000 presidential election right now...?


**Question:** How much thought have you given to the upcoming election for president—quite a lot, or only a little?

### Getting to Know You


**Question:** I'm going to read the names of some prominent people. Please tell me whether you have a generally favorable or unfavorable opinion of each one ...?



**Note:** Familiarity Index is calculated by combining those who at least have an impression of the candidate, favorable or unfavorable. Asked of registered voters.



**Question:** Is there any candidate running this year that you think would make a good president, or not?








