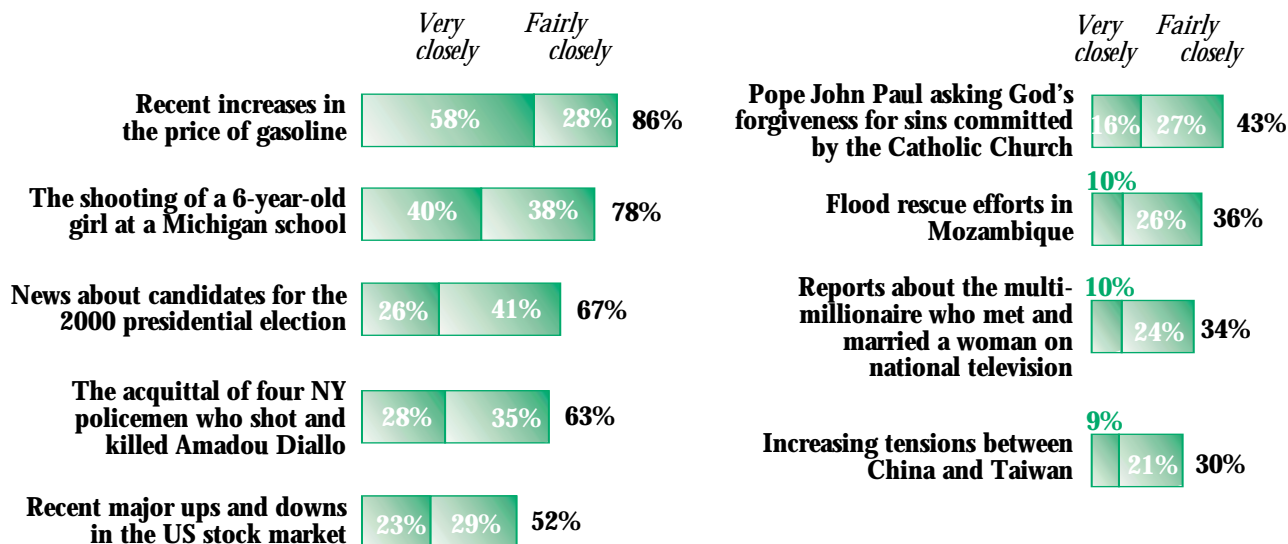


News Interest Index

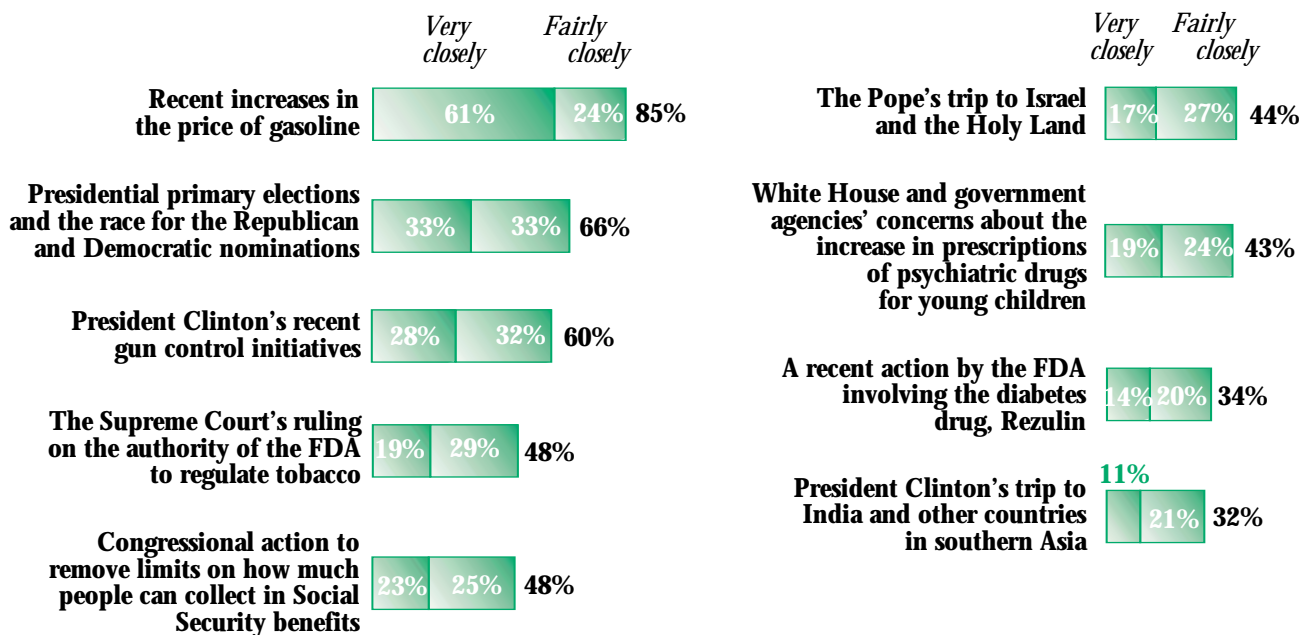

Health News Index

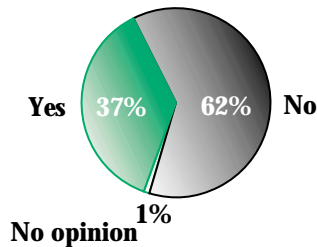

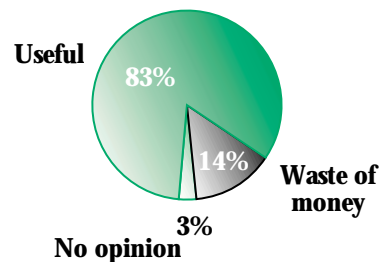
Stand Up and Be Counted

Question: Have you happened to see any television ads in recent weeks by the Census encouraging citizens to return their Census forms, or have you not seen these ads?



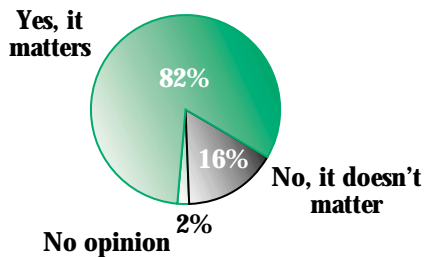

Question: Do you think the Census is useful, or do you think it's a waste of money?



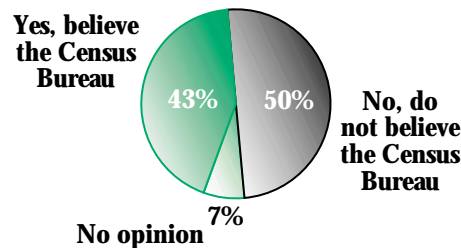

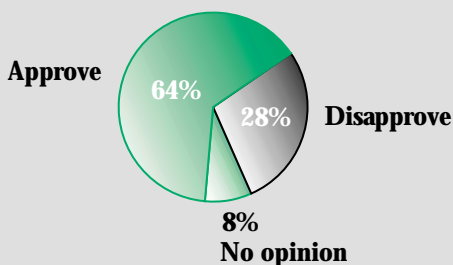

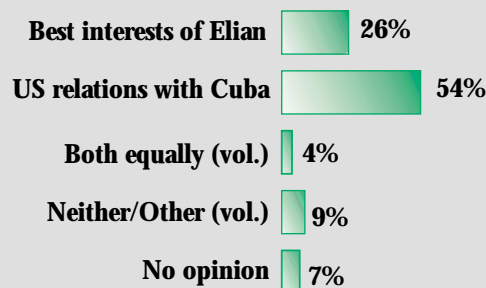
Elían Gonzalez
