



Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way George W. Bush is handling his job as president?


Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is handling its job?




Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way Democrats in Congress are handling their job?


Six Months

Question: Do you consider the first six months of this year's session of Congress to be a success or a failure?






Question: This year, have Republicans and Democrats in Washington been working together more to solve problems, or have they been bickering and opposing one another more than usual?


Lazy, Hazy, Crazy Days
