
Question: Which of the two options reflects more correctly your position?


















Question: Which of the following possibilities should the Israeli Defense Forces and the security forces employ in dealing with the disturbances in Judea, Samaria, and Gaza?







Question: In the Middle East situation, are your sympathies more with Israel or more with the Arab nations?* (Asked of those who had heard or read about the situation in the Middle East)




