














Editor's Note: Americans and Japanese differ sharply in many facets of family life. Traditional norms remain strong in Japan, though they are weakening. Divorce, which has impacted so massively on American families, has remained less frequent in Japan. Americans hold to more individualist norms throughout. (The comparative US/Japan data on page 22 are from the 1990 World Values Survey (taken in these two countries and 16 others). Most of the data which follow on pp. 23-26 are from surveys taken only in Japan by various of the country's survey organizations.













Question: Do you think civic responsibility and public morals are being well observed in Japan today?
