






**Question:** Do you approve or disapprove of the way (President) Bill Clinton is handling his job as president?



### **Clinton Soundings Around the STATES**


**Question:** Do you approve or disapprove of the job Bill Clinton is doing as president?





# Connecticut Excellent 5%






