





Presence of Parent in Household 59% 54%




White Children Under 18 Yrs. of Age, By Presence of Parent in Household


Question: Earlier on in American history, many people thought the U.S. was the very best place in the world to live. Do you think it still is, nor not?

percent saying they "believe in the American Dream"




Racism A Problem...

Question: How big a problem is racism in our society today? Is it a big problem, somewhat of a problem, a small problem or not a problem at all?























Question: Which would you prefer as a name for your race...African-American or black?







































Still No Republican Base Among African Americans, Save Possibly Among Those With Higher Incomes


Belief in America's Promise

Question: A basic American belief has been that if you work hard you can get ahead—reach the goals you set and more. Does that still hold true?






Equality of Opportunity Preferred to Equality of Result






















What Values to Encourage in Children? Some Similarities and Some Differences







percent responding "same schools"




percent responding "improved relations"










Reaching for a Society Beyond Race
