



Question: Do you have more confidence or less confidence than you had a year ago in the government's ability to solve the inflation problem?






























Question: How much of a problem is crime in the US?






Republicans and Democrats Agree on Economy's Strength

Still, Democrats Say Economic Problems Worst, **Republicans Say Moral Problems Worst**










Question: If this country's economic problems were solved, do you believe that most of the country's moral problems would also be solved, many of them would be solved, only a few would be solved, or none at all?


