



JULY 1 • Hong Kong Reverts to Chinese Sovereignty

Question: Do you think Hong Kong should remain part of the British Empire or should it be turned over to China?





Question: Overall, do you think that Britain's decision to give control of Hong Kong back to China will make things worse for the people of Hong Kong?






Question: Do you think civil liberties, such as a free press, will continue in Hong Kong under Chinese authority?


JULY 4 • Pathfinder Space Probe Lands on Mars

Question: Still thinking about the next century, which if any, of the following things will happen... humans will walk on Mars?





Question: Have you seen any of the pictures that the Mars Rover took of the surface of Mars, or not?






Question: Do you think that at some time in the past there has been life of some sort on the planet Mars, or not?


...The Public Makes Smart Distinctions


Question: Do you think there will ever be a McDonald's on Mars?





JULY 8 • Fiftieth Anniversary of Roswell Alien


Question: How much have you heard about an incident which occurred in Roswell, New Mexico in 1947 which some people believe was caused by a spacecraft from another planet which crashed there...?



Question: Do you believe that a spacecraft from another planet crashed in Roswell, New Mexico in 1947 or not?







Question: United Parcel Service, UPS, workers are now on strike. Which side are you more inclined to sympathize with in this strike—the Teamsters Union or UPS?




Question: United Parcel Service, UPS, workers are now on strike. Which side are you more inclined to sympathize with in this strike—the union or the company?



Question: So far, has the UPS (United Parcel Service) strike had an impact on you or any deliveries you were expecting or wanted to make?





AUGUST 31 • Princess Diana Dies in Paris Car Crash


SEPTEMBER 6 • Funeral Held in London


Question: Do you plan to watch any of Princess Diana's funeral?




SEPTEMBER 5 • The Death of Mother Theresa

Question: Thinking of all women who have lived any time in this century, what woman do you admire the most?





Question: Thinking now about Mother Theresa who recently died, do you consider Mother Theresa a saint, or not?




OCTOBER 4 • The Promise Keepers Gather on the Mall in Washington, in the Largest Religious Assembly in US History




Social Views of Participants in the Promise Keepers' Washington Assembly

Question: Do you favor or oppose...?


Making it harder for married couples with children to obtain divorce




Allowing homosexuals to marry and have the same legal rights as other married couples




School vouchers to attend private or religious school




Question: In a marriage, do you think that the husband should have primary responsibility for, or the wife should, or do you think this should be shared equally between them...?




Question: Does...[your wife] work because she needs in order to help your family's finances, because she wants to, or for both reasons?

Question: Do you think your wife would prefer to work outside the home, or would she prefer not to work?



OCTOBER 30 • Louise Woodward Convicted of Second-Degree Murder in the Death of Infant in Her Care


NOVEMBER 10 • Judge Reduces Charge to Manslaughter and Frees Woodward




