




Ouestion: What do you think is the most important problem facing this country today?










"Would you say you approve or disapprove of most of his (President Bush's) proposals (to deal with the illegal drug problem)?"

#### **ENOUGH SPENDING**








"...Are we spending too much, too little, or about the right amount on...dealing with drug addiction?"

"Would you, yourself, be willing to pay higher federal income taxes to help combat drug use?












