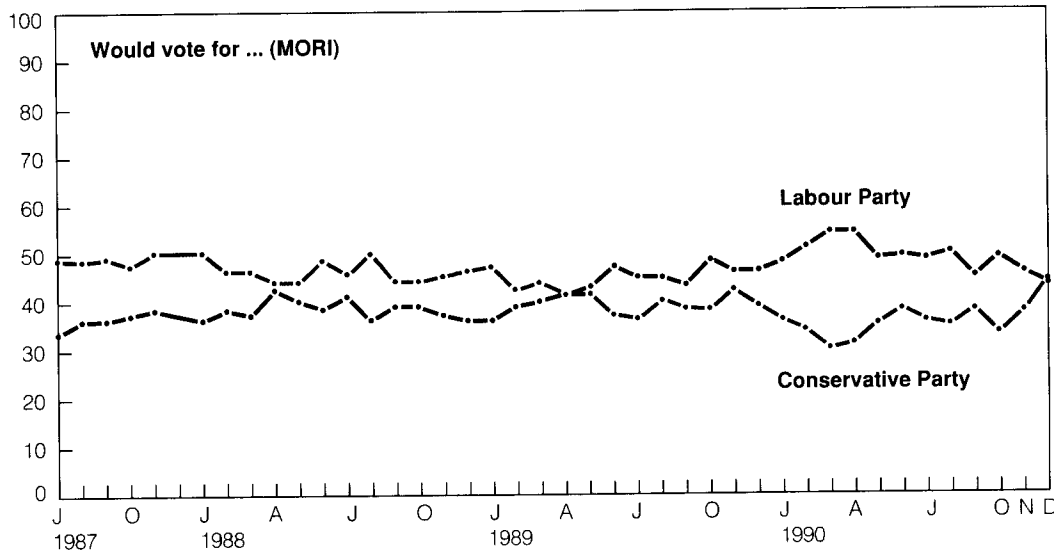


MAJOR MOVEMENT IN BRITAIN?

In early soundings since John Major became Britain's prime minister, the Conservatives have taken a narrow lead in vote intention and opposition leader Neil Kinnock's positive ratings have declined. The Iron Lady goes out in style.

Question: **How would you vote if there were a general election tomorrow? (MORI) If there were a general election tomorrow, which party would you support? (British Gallup)**

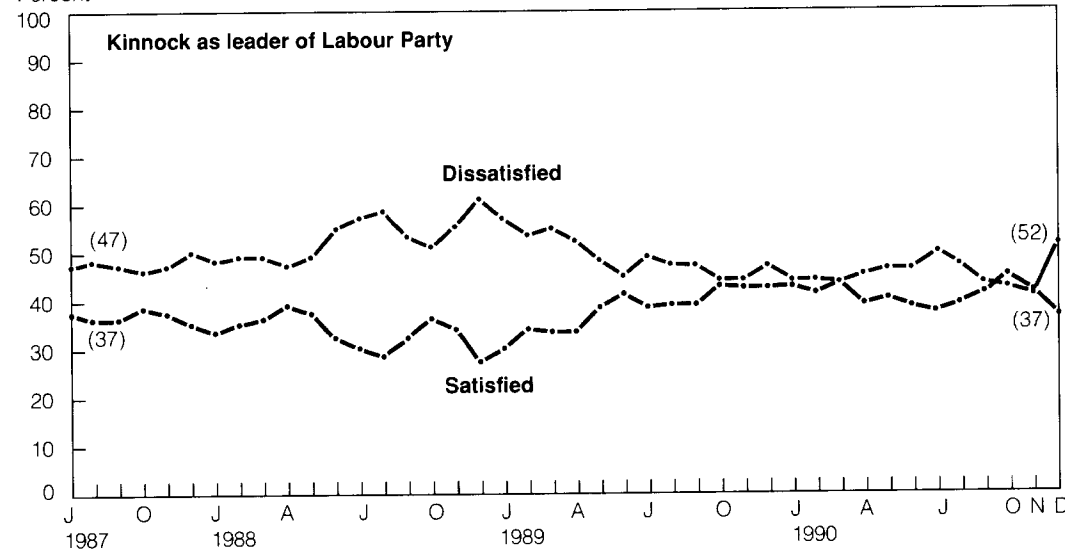

Note: In a Harris Research Centre (London) poll conducted December 12-13, 1990, 45% of respondents said John Major would make the best prime minister, compared to 21% who said that Neil Kinnock would. These responses are not significantly different from those given in a Harris survey taken November 28. Sixty percent of respondents also said in November that Major should discontinue former Prime Minister Thatcher's policies.

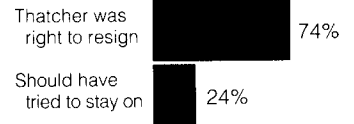

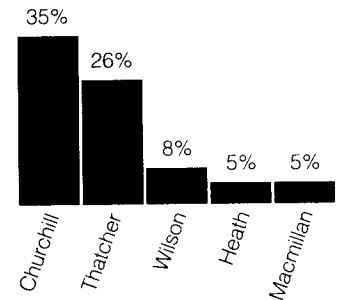
