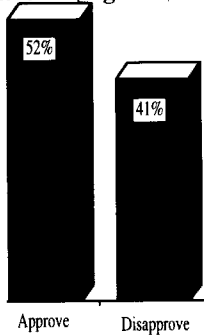

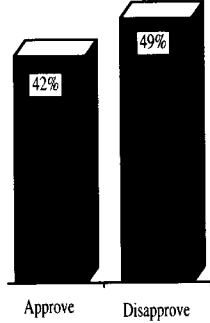

The President's Approval Percentage Stands at About 50

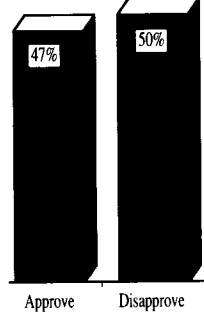

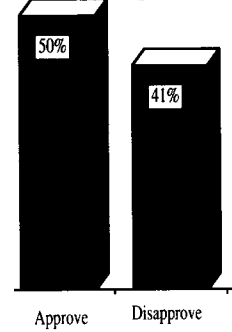

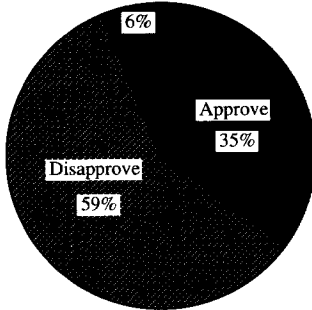

Congress Continues to Get Very Low Marks; Mixed Readings on Sentiment Vis-a-Vis Incumbents

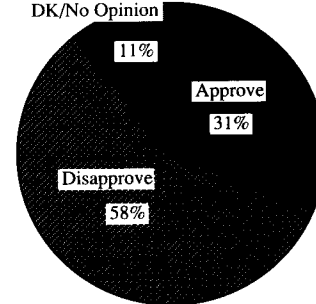

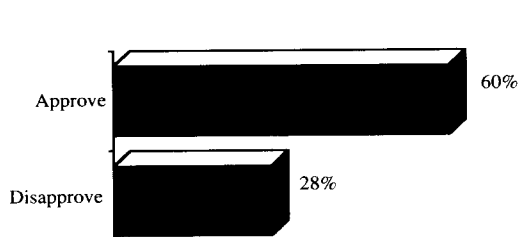
Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way the US Congress is doing its job?

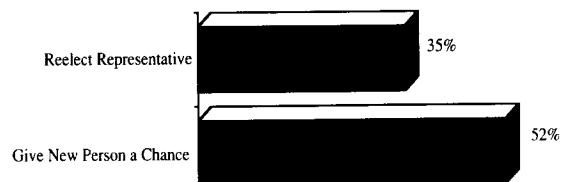
Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way the Democrats in Congress are handling the nation's economy?

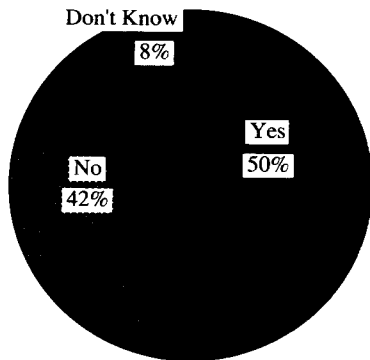
Registered Voters



Question: Looking ahead to the 1992 election for US Congress, do you feel your representative deserves to be reelected, or do you think it is time to give a new person a chance?

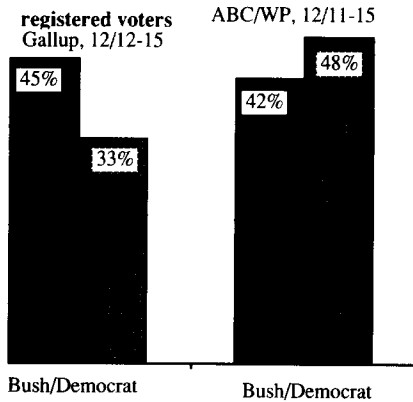

Bush is Down on "Re-Elect" Measures; But Still Strong Compared to His Challengers

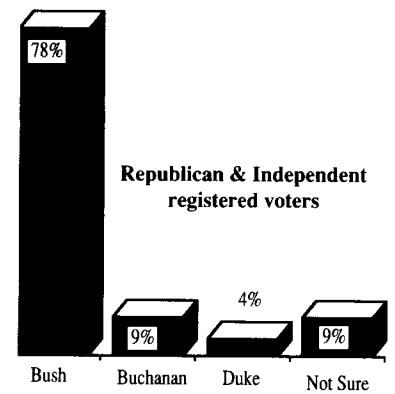


Question: Do you think President Bush deserves to be reelected in 1992?

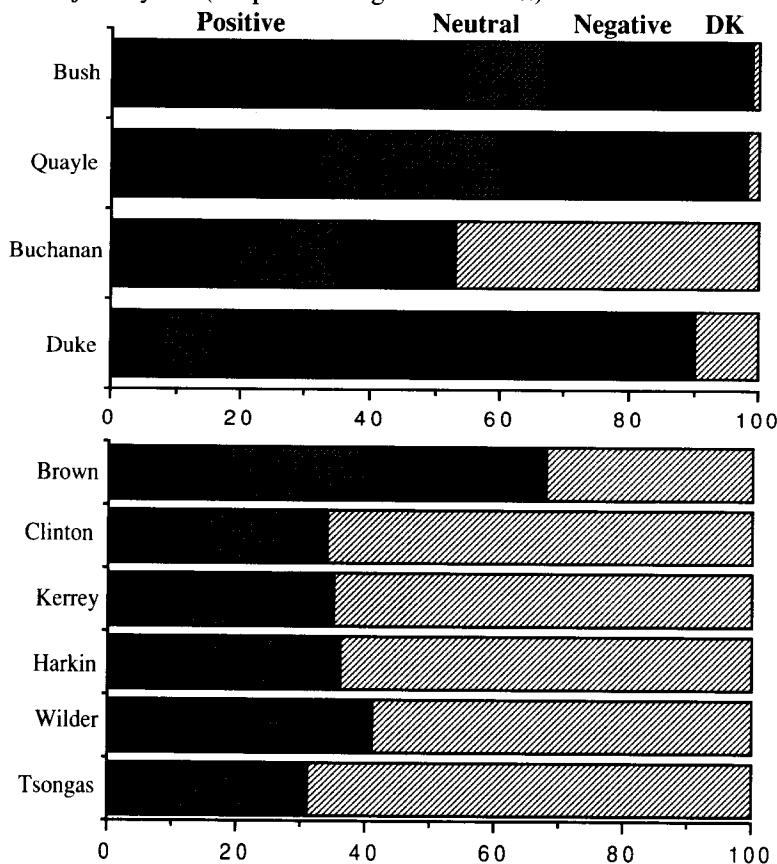

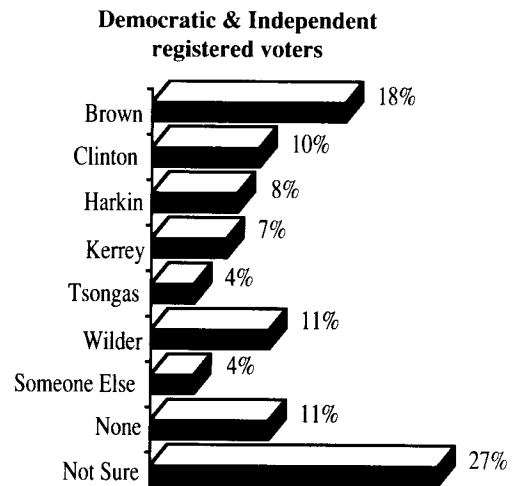

Without Cuomo, a Democratic Free-For-All

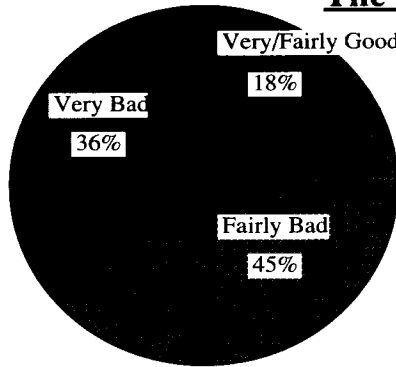


Question: ...If the Democratic primary for president were being held today, which candidate would you favor?

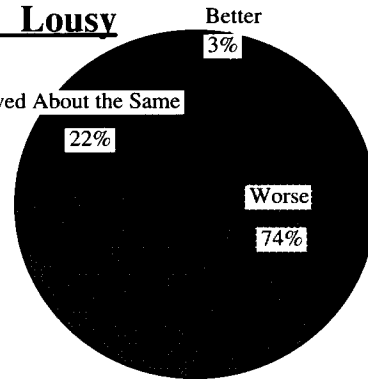
Americans' Verdicts on the Economy in December Continued the Pattern Begun Earlier in the Fall

Question: Would you rate the condition of the national economy these days: very good, fairly good, fairly bad or very bad?

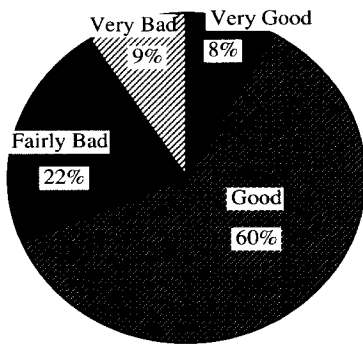

Question: Over the past year, do you think the national economy has gotten better, gotten worse, or stayed about the same? (Response of registered voters.)

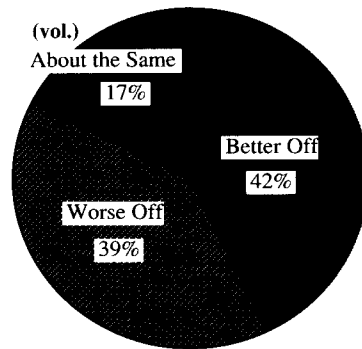

My Own Economic Position? O.K.



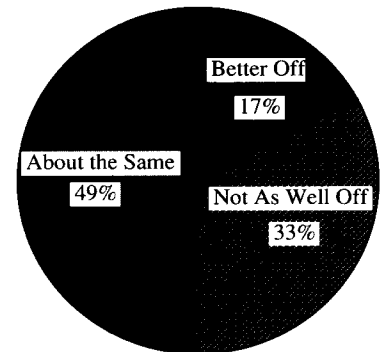
Question: How would you rate your own economic situation these days? Is it very good, fairly good, fairly bad or very bad?

Question: Would you say that you and your family are better off or worse off than you were four years ago? (Response of registered voters.)

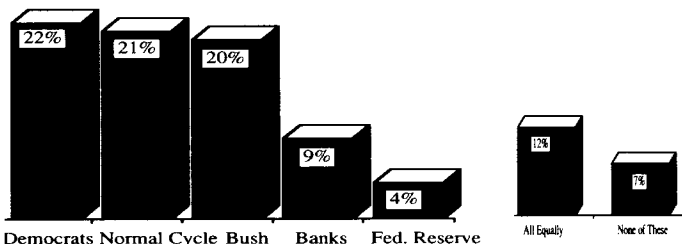

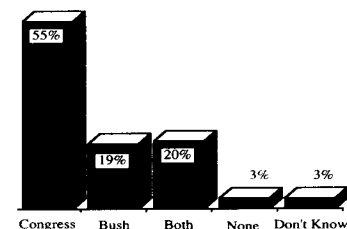
Who's to Blame?

Question Wordings, Bush Rating:
